- INL is the first laboratory in Europe dedicated to nanotechnology with an international legal status. INL has established partnerships with universities and research centers in Europe, North America, and Asia.

- INL as an organization resulted from the collaboration between Portugal and Spain. However, it is now possible for other countries to participate in this project as members of the organization.
